

YOUTH DEVELOPMENT

CHILDCARE PROGRAMS

- 1102 Kids served in the Afterschool Program.
- 219 Youth were awarded scholarships
- 306 campers explored hands on, enriching activities in our Summer Day Camp Program
- **34** The Little Explorer's Preschool Program was at max capacity. Fifty-three percent received a Y scholarship or other funding through the Texas Workforce Commission.

YOUTH PROGRAMMING

Kids stayed active and engaged in the Y's youth programming

The Y impacted over 56 kids through the Y's Scholarship Program. The youth sports department also worked with the children in the **EMERGENCY CHILDCARE Program for Essential Workers**, providing them with physical

activity during a stressful and uncertain time in their lives.

- 237 Swim lessons taught to 158 children
- **49** Average number of kids who participated in swim team monthly.
- **58** Children received safety around water lessons, during the Y's **LEARN TO SWIM WEEK.**
- **87** Different young men were awarded with "Player of the game" during the Y's eight week football season.

 These boys displayed outstanding skill, work ethic and overall leadership.



HEALTHY LIVING

The Y is continuing to improve the health and well-being of the San Angelo community, by bringing families together, encouraging good health, and fostering connections through fitness, sports and fun. Through a collaborative network of health, wellness and preventative services we are able to impact more lives.

Through community partnerships with the **San Angelo Diabetes Coalition** and **Better Living for Texans**, members of the San Angelo Community were able to educate themselves through health and diabetes health seminars, learning about proper diet, exercise and diabetes prevention. All free of charge.

Due to the Covid-19 pandemic these in-person classes were cancelled and reinvented to occur virtually.



The Y hosted 3 local **BLOOD DRIVES** with Vitalant. With 60 donors these blood drives helped saved 196 lives!

In 2020 the Y's Group Fitness department held over 20 unique group fitness classes each week. After the COVID-19 pandemic 5 of those classes were offered **VIRTUALLY** via Facebook Live!
